Their website will have information on what services the school provides and explain how a student will need to request those services.

You can also do an ADVANCED SEARCH and search for schools based on:

- **Size of the school**
- **Primarily Online Instruction**
- **Disability-Related Programs and Courses**
- **Minority Serving (HBCUs)**
- **Disability-Related Services**
- **Courses or Degree Programs in the Area of Disability**
