

#### Freshmen: (Freshmen year DOES count!)

- Read a variety of books.
- Get involved in clubs and extracurricular activities. There are lots of opportunities available during the Activity Period!!!
- Do some community service and volunteer work.
- Use the **XELLO** link on the Clever App in your Office 365 account, Study Island, and other resources for exploring your career options.
- If your grades are not good, make sure you ask your teacher for help, use the tutoring support available during the Activity Period, use online resources for help such as Study Island (on your Clever App), and Khan Academy (<u>www.khanacademy.org</u>). Keep up with your classes!

#### Sophomore:

- Get your name and address on college mailing lists.
- Look for in-person and virtual college fairs you can attend.
- Visit the Career Center and Career Center page on the SCHS website and look at the college information and resources available as you research colleges.
- Visit college websites and gather college information including entrance requirements, size, location, college programs, special facilities, etc.

#### Junior:

- Keep in mind that some colleges require more than the minimum high school graduation requirements (math, foreign language). Continue to take the most challenging classes!!!
- It is recommended that Juniors plan to take their <u>FIRST</u> SAT (<u>www.collegeboard.org</u>) and/or ACT (<u>www.act.org</u>) no later than the end of their junior year. Start thinking about when you will take these tests!!!

- Continue to work on scholarship applications and research additional financial aid sources. Keep copies of everything. Visit the Career Center page on the SCHS website for a list of scholarship opportunities and scholarship search engines. Use <u>ALL</u> your resources to search for scholarships.
- Look on college websites for separate applications to apply for scholarships and grants.

If an in-person tour is not available, colleges usually have virtual tours available. Please check the college's website for information about what types of tours they offer and how you can register for them. Ideally, touring the college campuses you are considering is the best way to find out if a college is for you. However, you may not have the opportunity to personally visit a college campus and...just because you may want to attend a school out of state doesn't mean you have to spring for plane tickets to every university on your Top 10 list. Many of the college websites also

provide a virtual tour of their campus....be sure to check it out! To help whittle down the choices, there are also websites where you can find **VIRTUAL COLLEGE TOURS**!!!

### **College Testing Information**

\*\*Several colleges are TEST OPTIONAL again this year for admissions. However, some schools have a GPA requirement in order to apply for admissions as test optional. In addition, some schools are still requiring an SAT or ACT score in order to qualify for certain scholarships. Check with each college's website you are interested in to see what their test optional policy is for this year.

**Fair Test:** This list includes institutions that are "test optional", "test flexible" or otherwise de-emphasize the use of standardized tests by making admissions decisions about substantial numbers of applicants who recently graduated from U.S. high schools without using the SAT or ACT. **Scoring:** Colleges will use their own method to evaluate scores sent. Some colleges take your best single sitting; others take your best score from each test section over multiple sittings (SuperScore).

#### When should you take the SAT or ACT?

It is recommended that students take the SAT or Act for the **<u>FIRST</u>** time **no later than the end of their junior year**. Students who choose to take the SAT or ACT a second time typically do so in the summer or fall of senior year.

#### How do I know which test to take: SAT or ACT?

There really is not a straightforward answer to this question. The best way to decide is to take a timed full-length practice test of each. A few general differences are that the ACT has more geometry and trigonometry, ACT has sections where you cannot use a calculator, SAT provides more time per question, SAT provides some diagram of math formulas, and ACT has a science section testing your critical thinking skills (not your specific science knowledge). There is no longer a penalty for getting questions wrong on SAT. The old adage of if you do better in English take the ACT and if you do better in Math take SAT is not true for every student. Again, take a full-length practice test of each to see which test is best for you. Full-length practice tests are available on the **College Board website (SAT)** https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/sat/practice-preparation and the ACT website www.act.org/content/act/en/products-and-services/the-act/test-preparation/free-act-test-prep.html.

#### Resources to help you prepare to take the SAT or ACT:

The best thing you can do is take time to prepare and get familiar with the test format before you take the test and **PRACTICE**! There are many resources out there to help you prepare for either the SAT or ACT. Some resources require a fee, while many others are completely **FREE**! Students are also welcome to visit the Career Center to find additional resources or to use the computers to start preparing for the tests!!!

The websites below have **FREE** practice questions, study guides, articles, flashcards, quizzes, formulas, exam strategies, punctuation rules, grammar rules and more!!! You have no more excuses...it's time for YOU to get started!!!

#### Activity Period: There will be SAT/ACT Prep available during the Activity Period. Be sure to sign up for it!!!

**Study Island:** Students have access to Study Island by going into their Office 365 account and clicking on their "Clever App" and then clicking on the Study Island icon. Once they are in Study Island, click on the *US PROGRAMS* tab on the left, and then click on *ACT* or *SAT*.

# **Transcript Policy**

Students have several options regarding transcripts.

- Each senior will be given one free unofficial transcript in the beginning of his or her senior year.
- Hard copies of transcripts cost \$2.00.
- Transcripts for scholarships are free.
- Transcripts are free for students who qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch.
- Transcripts sent electronically are free.
- All seniors will receive a free official final transcript mailed to the school/employer/etc. of their choice after they graduate.
- All seniors will have a free unofficial copy, included in their high school diploma envelope at the end of the year.
- A Transcript Request Form must be completed for each transcript and payment must be made at the time of the request. The forms are available in the Career Center, Counseling Office or on the St. Charles High School website.

# Seniors must give the Counseling Office a minimum of <u>five school days</u> to complete their transcript requests unless extensive additional paperwork is required.

In fact, according to the NCAA Eligibility Center, very few high school athletes earn athletic scholarships. According to recent statistics, about two percent of high school athletes are awarded athletic scholarships to compete in college. This small number means high school student-athletes and their parents need to have realistic expectations about receiving an athletic scholarship to play college sports. Academic, not athletic, achievement is the most reliable path to success in life.
